Jimmy is one of the grounds keepers at Golden Gate Park. He likes and repairs old cars; and almost twenty years ago he organized a gathering in Speedway Meadows. Last year they had about 2,000 cars, some Airstream trailers, and the requisite contingent of Harleys. As has been the custom for the past several years, the SF Fire Department brought one of their vintage fire engines for the day.

The is NOT a Concours d'Elegance. Cars run the gamut from Model T's to Muscle cars, and in every condition from barely legal "projects" to 100 point restorations. Everyone shows up with their barbeque gear and has a big "family reunion", coming from as far as Oregon, Nevada, and L.A. It is free to spectators who wander in, and there are several thousand every year. If you want to bring a car and park it in the meadows, it is \$20, and clubs are encouraged. It is low key and low publicity, but a lot of fun.

I started bringing a car to the show every year about a dozen years ago after Jimmy poked his head into my garage while I was under an old FIAT (please, no "Fix It Again Tony" jokes...), talked to me about my project, and invited me to the gathering in the Park. Now I see a lot of the same people each year, and compare skinned knuckles and automotive horror stories.

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Remembering Phil Frank Tour to Bolinas

We are saddened by the loss of cartoonist and MG enthusiast Phil Frank. He had been suffering from a brain tumor for months before passing away on September 13th.

Frank, a longtime resident of Sausalito, was perhaps best known for his comic strip *Farley*, which chronicled the life and times of the characters of the Bay Area though the exploits of a newspaper reporter, and sometime park ranger, named Farley. With bushy hair and a large mustache, Farley resembled, and was oft considered a stand in for, his creator.

Working with Joe Troise, Frank drew five other comic strips: the nationally syndicated *The Elderberries, Chateau Defeat, Miles to Go*, and both *Nigel Shiftright, Automotive Anachronism* and the eponymous *Frank and Troise* for Road & Track magazine. In April of 2006, Road & Track test drove Frank's 1949 MG TC for their April Fools road test.

The Abingdon Rough Riders have been invited for lunch at the Frank's place in Bolinas by Phil's widow, Susan. The Rough Riders have a tradition of touring to the Frank's each August, but couldn't this year because of circumstances. Susan has invited us now to remember Phil.

Mt. Hamilton Tour

At the meeting point, four MGs and four members, plus one guest, showed up for the tour. We took a quick vote and decided that four was a good number. We had a quorum, so we headed up the hill. Ken Gittings roared up the hill in his green '67 GT; and bringing up the rear was our new member, Cole Lucas, in his white '79 B. It was a great run up the hill with no traffic ahead or behind. I was surprised when we passed some bicyclists near the summit. They looked wet and cold, not my idea of a good time. When we stopped for a break halfway up the hill, Cole complained that we were going too slow—he couldn't get out of 2nd gear. I had been mostly in 3rd all the way, so I was surprised. I think we must have different rear end ratios; and there is probably a horsepower difference between a '74 and a '79.

Inside the Octagon

In 1995, documentary film maker Gary Watson released a special documentary called "Inside the Octagon". The focus of the film was the birth and development of the MG up to 1945. It contained interviews with John Thornley (Founder of the MG Car Club of England in 1930, later General Manager of the MG Car Company, who was instrumental in the development of the MGB), Jean Cook Kimber (daughter of Cecil Kimber, who was the driving force in developing MG into a world class sports car company) and former factory workers, among others. The film is highly engaging and well done, filled with rare MGs and vintage footage. I have seen it and it is outstanding. Here's what others have said:

After completing that project, which met with much acclaim, he began work on "Inside the Octagon II", which covers MG history from 1946 to 1980. The board of the MG Owner's Club recently watched a ten minute clip promoting the second documentary, and voted to contribute to the project. So our club will be listed in the credits of the film.
