

Why are we here? As Sam pondered what to ponder this month, I wondered: why are we here? No, not why are we alive or why are we here on Earth, but why are we in the MG Owners Club and presently reading *The Octagon*? And as I thought about it, I realized that the answer was perhaps more complex than the question I had idly asked. Why *am* I doing this? It was clear, at least as clear as it can be when one is straining for what to write, that this question would require a bit of inquiry.





<u>Membership Survey Report</u>: Randy presented the Survey Committee's recommendations. The main areas identified for improvement by the survey were the Club Web site, recruitment, events, and the newsletter.

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- Web site The Web site should be revamped, perhaps by an outside (professional) firm. Possible additions include calendar and photo sections that members can contribute to, an online membership application, and a link to a Facebook page for the MGOC.
- Recruitment Membership reflects strong participation in the South & East Bay, and we should emphasize recruitment in those areas. The committee recommended against establishing sub-chapters.
- Events Members like large events, such as the NAMGAR Regional held last year, and several members are unable to attend events out of their immediate area. Recommendations include 1) A Show-n-Shine event for all local British clubs, perhaps also with a BBQ, to encourage increased participation without increased overhead. 2) Start a program to give older members rides to events in other members' MGs. This was dubbed the Co-pilot Program. 3) Use Evite as an invitation system for MGOC events along with the "flash" email now used.
- Newsletter The survey showed that *The Octagon* is the only reason some people are members. Starting a "Starbucks Article of the Month" award (or some other reward mechanism) to get articles submitted by the membership was proposed. Articles could be general, technical, event reports, and so on, with selections made by the editor. Published articles would receive the award.

During the following discussion, it was pointed out that these were very similar to other recommendations, coming down to finding new people to carry out the tasks, plus spending some money. What to implement, in what order, and at what effort and cost were discussed at length. The recommendation to concentrate recruiting where membership was already strong was also questioned. The Committee was asked to prioritize their suggestions, estimate their cost, determine if volunteers are available if needed, and provide more details, to present to the Board at a later date. The details would be in the form of who will be responsible for developing recommendations, what will exactly be done, and by what time – in short, an action plan.

We will make the survey results available to the membership via PDF from the Club Web site.

<u>Changes to allotment for MGs by the Bay and Electrical Tech Session</u> <u>expenses</u>: A motion was made to reimburse the Kuenzingers for their expenses for MGs by the Bay for signage, vests, and other materials.
