Saw Mill Tour 2012

Date: Sunday, August 19, 2012

Tour: We will be visiting an old steam driven saw mill located in Sebastopol that dates back over 100 years, called Sturgeon's Mill. The saw mill is being restored and operated by a group of enthusiastic volunteers. It is only open to the public for 8 days a year. We will have a private docent led tour around the mill grounds and then be able to watch them cutting redwood trees into lumber. The 60" diameter saw blade is amazing and then there's a 42" blade above it for even larger trees. Everything is done the old fashioned way with chains and hooks and archaic machinery, so it's really interesting. There is no charge for the tour and demonstration but donations are much appreciated for the continued restoration.

We will meet at the Sonoma Bagel and Café in Rohnert Park and head out through the rolling backroads of Sonoma to the saw mill. After the mill tour we will have a short driver to the Union Hotel in Occidental for lunch where we can order from the open menu.

After lunch you can walk around Occidental or continue on the tour to Andy's Produce Market which is on our way home to the freeway. This is the largest outside produce market in Northern California and prides itself with the best selection of locally grown fruit and vegetables all year round.

While this event was originally intended for owners of pre-1956 MG cars it has since been expanded to all MGs. The event featured a car show, scenic country drive/rally, tech sessions, swap meet, auction, an awards dinner during which a number of MGOC'ers were recognized, and lots of fun opportunities to meet and interact with other fellow MG owners. Next year's GoF West event – which promises to be equally entertaining -- will be held in Carefree Arizona. Several MGOC'ers are already planning to make the trip… why don't you plan to join them.

If you weren't one of the some 40 old MGOC'ers that attended this Saturday's (6/30), John Bertolotti Tour you missed a truly special event. John, a great story teller with an amazing depth of knowledge about America's prewar car history. He took the group on fascinating journey back in time to the early 1900s when America's cities were facing a dire pollution and public health crisis -- horse manure. Cities depended on horses for their daily functioning and these horses produced huge amounts of manure. In 1900 New York city had over 100,000 horses that produced over 2.5 million pounds of manure per day. Imagine a time when cars were seen as the "solution to pollution!" Fast forward just twenty years and American had over 2500 different car manufacturers. Add this historical savvy to John's terrific sense of humor and you can easily see why such a good time was had by all who attended.

Going forward, the annual MGA National "Get together" will be held in Dayton, OH, the week of July 9th and Club member Mike Jacobsen plans to drive there... let's all wish him a safe cross country journey. Coming up on July 21st, is the annual MGOC picnic. Don't miss it!

On another note, club member Bud Alderson recently brought CA AB (Assembly Bill) 1224 to my attention. Club members likely know that in 2004, CA repealed the rolling emissions-test exemption for vehicles 30 years old and older and replaced it with a law requiring the lifetime testing of all 1976 and newer model-year vehicles. AB 1224, a bill introduced in the California Senate by Senator Doug LaMalfa (Senator.LaMalfa@senate.ca.gov), would exempt all motor vehicles prior to the 1981 model year from the emissions inspection requirement. This bill initially has been granted reconsideration after it failed to be approved by a Senate Transportation and Housing Committee on a 3-4 vote (with two committee members not voting). The bill will be reconsidered in a future committee hearing. Those who voted in favor of the bill were Senators Gaines, Harman and Wyland. Those who voted against are Senators DeSaulnier, Lowenthal, Pavley and Simitian. Senators Kehoe and Rubio did not vote on the bill. I urge you to contact Contact Senators DeSaulnier, Lowenthal, Pavley, Simitian, Kehoe and Rubio to Request Their Support for S.B. 1224. http://bangshift.com/blog/sema-needs-help-to-exempt-all-pre-1981-vehicles-from-smog-in-california.html.

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
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
