






I Became an Anglophile

What Could Possibly Go Wrong?

I was twenty-four, a sweet, innocent, cherished, protected, only child, with LUST, wanderlust growing in my heart. So here I was in a foreign land far from home on my own for the first time in my life! I had found a job teaching second grade at RAF Upper Heyford, a then USAF base. It was the sixties and England, with the Beatles leading the English Revolution with iconic songs, bell bottoms, mini skirts, trouser suits for women, promise of all the freedom in the world finally for me.

My first task was to find a place to stay. Another teacher, Joyce, and I were shown a manor house in Shipton-under-Wychwood in the Cotswolds, outside of Oxford. The stately home built in 1603 had a colorful history with a ghost and had currently been divided into eight flats, many of them rented by teachers like us. Ours had a Wedgewood bathtub that was so large, you could float in it. And if you left dishes in the sink, they'd freeze. And there was a shilling meter.

The next very important task was to find a car! Ken, an English car salesman visited our base. It didn't take any convincing to sell me a British Racing Green MGB and Joyce, my flat mate, a blue one. Since I lived in the countryside, Ken suggested I get a "pub light" to put on the outside window when I visited a pub in the dark countryside. Other motorists would know a small car was parked along the road. It worked! I remember him delivering the MGs to our home! It was love at first sight. I loved the drive to work through the countryside, left at a cow, right at the butcher with no fingers, over the Windrush River's one lane bridge, and onto the base. Perfect!

The two years of living in England brought love of my MGB everyday. I took it to the continent for two months two different summers. We two lucky young girls took a bright orange canvas tent, two blow up mattresses for sleeping and floating in rivers and lakes, two sleeping bags, a bathing suit, a change of underwear, a skirt and a dress (ladies did not wear trousers then), a Sterno can, two knives, forks, and spoons, and a small saucepan. There was no room for our convertible top.

Off we began across the Channel, through Amsterdam and up to Copenhagen. It was there we met five handsome young Danes who worked on the Rothchild's historic yacht and offered us a tour of it. We returned the favor by piling them into our MG and driving them into town. After all, with our tent pitched in a campground, there was plenty of room for the handsome, happy Danes.

We continued for two months working our way south through hills, mountains, canals, rivers, large cities, towns, farms, and all manner of animals. We camped on steep mountains in the Alps where curious cows with large bells were our alarm clocks. We camped on castle grounds in Salzberg where chamber music wafted through tall windows. We camped in the Munich zoo where lions roared at night and our neighbor kept an immense boa constrictor skin in his tent.

We kept our maps under our heels at the accelerator. The floor boards were so hot. When it rained, we put the tent's ground tarp over the car. The MG was washed using water from a river and our saucepan. We kept Windex and paper towels to wash the windscreen frequently.

When queueing to pass a border or get on a ferry, we washed other cars' windscreens. Those two cute English girls in that great English car were spreading goodwill throughout the continent. At the end of my contract, my MG was shipped home and it continued to make memories until one rainy winter it began to rust. Then the neighborhood teenage boys began to work on it. My husband and I finally got to our bucket list and In 2010, it was given a second chance at life by the folks at On the Road Again. What could go wrong? Nothing! I became an Anglophile, kept my MGB and my wonderful English friends and visit Britain whenever I can. A lifelong love affair. That's what happened!

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


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MGOC Annual Awards Banquet


