From the Editor...

... 5th Annual Brexit Fall Classic ...

Brexit is an abbreviation for "British Exit," which refers to the June 23, 2016 referendum whereby British citizens voted to exit the European Union and was patterned after several prior attempts by Greece to similarly exit the European Union, which at the time was coined "Grexit." Following the news of *Brexit*, markets and currencies were sent to its lowest levels in decades, resulted in the resignation of Britain's Prime Minister, David Cameron, and it may be another two years before the full effects of *Brexit* are fully realized.

However, another *Brexit* occurred nearly 70 years ago, at the end of World War II, with an altogether different set of economic and social consequences. In 1922, there were over 183 motor companies in the UK. UK production was dominated by Morris (founded by William Morris in 1910 in Oxford) and Austin (founded by Herbert Austin in 1905 in Birmingham), which together, totaled up to 60% of total UK auto manufacturing output. In 1932, the UK overtook France to become Europe's largest car manufacturer. However, during World War II, car production in the UK gave way to military and commercial vehicle and aircraft production. In order to recover from the post-war depression, government controlled steel supply was prioritized for foreign export businesses, number one of which, was the export or "Brexit" of UK car manufacturing. In 1947, steel was made available only to businesses that exported at least 75% of it production. And so, 75% of all British car production were destined for foreign shores. As such, by 1950, the UK

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Toll Free 800-882-777753 VISA, MD, DISCOVER, PAYPAL, COD contributed to 52% of the world's exported vehicles. result of which, was a plethora of, now "Classic" British cars throughout the world, and in particular the United States, including many of our all-time favorites such as AC, Aston Martin, Bentley, Bristol, Jaguar, Land Rover, Lister, Lotus, MG, Morgan, Rolls-Royce, TVR and Vauxhall. Its no wonder that British Car gatherings will typically number in the hundreds locally, and thousands nationally.

One of the largest gatherings and benefactors of this UK automotive manufacturing Brexit is Bill and Mary Hiland's 5th Annual British, or now, *Brexit*, Fall Classic, in Morgan Hill during the weekend of September 17-18th. The *Brexit* celebration starts with an afternoon tour of Morgan Hill, followed by a Wine Reception at Hiland's On the Road Again, and then the official Brexit Fall Classic car show along the tree-lined downtown in Morgan Hill.

MGOC member, Wayne Otis Veatch Jr. passed away on Sunday July 17, 2016 at the age of seventy-four, from complications of metastatic colon cancer.

Wayne called me a few weeks before, when he knew the end was near, and asked if I would say some words at his memorial. I told him, I would be greatly honored. Wayne chose several people to talk about various aspects of his life: a colleague about his career as a corporate attorney, a friend about his vast experience in Scouting, mentoring boys and young me, and myself, to talk about his experience in the old car hobby.

If you knew Wayne, you know he had a dark green MGB roadster, a light green Studebaker Commander sedan, and a grey Studebaker Avanti. He told me that his interest in automobiles went back to his youth growing

up in Southern California.

When Janet and Wayne lived in Australia they had a few unusual cars, one a Morris Major sedan. He told me about how he bought the green MGB as an everyday car, and how it morphed into being a collectable. Before he would buy a car he would always do his research and find which were the desirable years and models. Could we expect any less from Wayne?

Janet, Wayne, my wife, Susan, and I, got to know each other through a number of MG clubs. Wayne discovered the MG Owners Club, and later Sorry Safari Touring Society. Over the years, we would go on day tours, overnight trips, and found that we had much in common: MGs, children, we both had two sons, all four are Eagle Scouts, and we all were on the same page when it came to politics and religion.

Once Wayne and Janet retired, they found more time to become active in the Wine Country Car Club, a group that includes some MG people and drivers of other sports cars and classics. The beautiful back roads of Marin, Sonoma, and Napa counties provided great warm weather drives, with stops at many of the region's outstanding wineries. Most recently, at our suggestion, Wayne and Janet joined us in another senior group of auto touring enthusiasts, CHVA.

Eight years ago, we invited Janet and Wayne to join us on New Year's Eve for an overnight trip to the Saint George Hotel in Volcano California. We dined, danced and toasted in the New Year, a tradition that would continue. New Year's Eve with the Veatchs became a regular thing. With two years at the Saint George, two times to the Madonna Inn in San Luis Obispo, once to the W Hotel in San Francisco, once to the Durant in Berkley, once to the Embassy Suites in Seaside, and this year to the Toll House in Los Gatos.

One particular story, that I remember fondly, was an MG tour to Hood River, Oregon for a big MG meet. Sue and I drove our '52 MG and the Veatchs drove their '67 MGB, both are by the way, British Racing Green. We both took first in our class in the car display.

We discovered long ago, the trip is often more fun that the event itself. We extended our trip home by heading down 395 to Reno, where we met another MG couple, Mike and Mary Sindicic, and displayed our three little

British Cars among all the big American hot rods, muscle cars and classics.

To celebrate Wayne and Janet's fortieth wedding anniversary and her birthday, we planned a trip to Calistoga, where we scheduled

famous hot mud baths, massages, and naturally drove MGs. Five o'clock cocktails with cheese and crackers were a standard of our journeys; Wayne's favorite was "the perfect Manhattan". The exact formula he extensively researched and perfected. It was so Wayne.

In so many ways, Wayne was a bit like a big brother to me. Being about five years older he always had my respect. Not only was Wayne a good

listener, but could also converse on a number subjects, and in native Spanish. His extensive reading provided him with background to speak intelligently without sounding opinionated.

When I was with Wayne I could see youthfulness. I felt I could see what he was like as a teenager and a young man. It was a youthful optimism, that he displayed, right up until the end. In February on a Valentine tour we found out that things were not going well, I was feeling low. But not Wayne, he hugged me and told me "he was going to drive this thing till the wheels fall off." What an attitude!

When I last saw him I told Wayne how deeply sorry I felt. He told me, "Hey don't feel sorry," and changed the subject. I couldn't tell him that it was me I felt sorry for, because I was losing a good friend, and that made me feel selfish. Good-bye old friend, gone but never forgotten.

SIERRA TOUR 2016 Fri Oct. 7 - Sun Oct. 9

The 2016 Sierra Tour will be unique in many ways, with two starting points. For our South and East Bay drivers, we will start in Pleasanton at the McDonald's at Santa Rita Road and I-580. Our North Bay drivers will depart from the square in Sonoma. Both groups will unite in Stockton for lunch at the Olive Garden Restaurant before beginning our less traveled route to Tahoe City and our base for the next 2 nights: River Ranch Lodge, www.riverranchlodge.com (530) 583-4264.

River Ranch is right on the Truckee River and has both a great bar and restaurant, so dinner Friday and Saturday nights will be in the Fireplace room. We have reserved the entire lodge, which has 19 rooms. Make your reservation ASAP, as it will fill up quickly.

Friday's drive from Stockton will be on two lane roads covering scenic countryside, mountain vistas and crossing both Carson Pass (El. 7960) and Luther Pass (El. 7740). We will drive the East side of Lake Tahoe to arrive at our lodge just North of Tahoe City. (246 miles)

Saturday: After breakfast at River Ranch, we will depart for Virginia City, NV, for coffee and sightseeing via Mount Rose (El. 8900). From Virginia City we will tour to Gardnerville, NV for lunch at J T's Basque Restaurant. Following lunch, we will return to River Ranch via the Kingsbury Grade and Daggett Pass (El. 7334) proceeding up the East side of Lake Tahoe to Tahoe City. Cocktails and dinner will be at River Ranch. (161 miles)

Sunday following breakfast and check out, we will head back over Luther and Carson Passes to Sutter Creek to regroup, have a milkshake and walk-about. From Sutter Creek, we will head down the hill to Lodi and our final lunch at the Lodi Beer Company, where the tour ends. (150 miles)

Total miles: 557 plus miles home from Lodi. This will be a rain or shine event covering some long and steep upgrades, downgrades and high mountain passes. Make sure your car and its brakes are up to the challenge, it could be difficult for TC's and TD's. The tour will be car optional; drive a car you are confident that can handle mountain driving.

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


