### Tales of Our Summer MG Tour in the UK

(Where in the world is Randy Grossman?, Part III)

The next day we visited Dove Cottage, the home of the William Wordsworth, the 19<sup>th</sup> century poet who produced some of the greatest poetry in the history of the English language. It was particularly meaningful for me as I have enjoyed his work since high school.

But the most surprising event was yet to come. While driving through Grasmere we noticed a sign announcing a classic car show would be held the next day on June 23rd. I casually turned to Melissa and said, "Hey, let's go to the show and enter our "hire" MGB. Melissa thought I was nuts, but for the fun of it, the following morning we drove to the show, and they let us in. What was really hilarious was that while walking around, we were approached by a Lion's Club representative, the show's sponsor, who asked if they could interview us. So the gentleman got on his microphone and said, "Well today we have some very special visitors all the way from California who brought a car to our little car show...well maybe not from California, but they drove an MGB from York. Randy would you tell us a little bit about your trip to the UK and your experience with classic British cars." I explained that I had a 1962 MGA MK II at home, and coincidentally that if we were home that day I would have been at the Palo Alto Concours, another Lion's Club sponsored car show. I also put in a nice plug for the MGOC and directed people to our website should anyone be traveling to Northern California and want some MG contacts. Melissa was asked if she shared my enthusiasm and she said, "Well to a degree, but I am definitely enjoying the trip including the restaurants we have gone to in the Lake District." Her comment reminded me of the recent IFC movie, The Trip which, with classic British humor, features the "foodie" restaurants now dotting the Lake District.

On our last day in the Lake District we went to a

museum in Coniston which celebrates the life of John Ruskin, the amazing 19th Century artist, teacher, amateur geologist, social critic, and philosopher who authored the famous *Until This Last* which inspired Gandhi and expressed his sentiment that "There is no Wealth but Life." In the same museum there was a tribute to Donald Campbell, the famous auto and speed boat racer who broke eight world speed records in the 1950s and 1960s, and raced his Bluebird K7 on Coniston Water, but tragically died in 1967 when his boat, traveling at over 320 MPH, flipped and broke apart.

Our last adventure in the Lake District involved driving to a glass blowing factory in Cumbria which was meaningful to me, because I have been taking glass blowing classes at the Crucible in Oakland. Melissa bought me a shot glass so I could enjoy some our fine Irish whiskey when we returned home.

So now, we headed back to York to return the MGB and catch the train back to London where we would spend four more memorable days, before returning home, but that is another story. On our way back from the Lake District to York we experienced our only major mechanical mishap of the trip. Seven miles from reaching Reflections Classic Car Hire, the fuel pump gave out, and we were concerned that we would miss our train. Thankfully, we were rescued by Charles Hils, the owner of Reflections, who whisked us off to the train station in time for our departure to London.

On the train we settled down and started gathering our memories. One thing became very clear. If you are going to take your major MG adventure, do it now, because you aren't getting any younger.

Some of you may remember going to the Englander Pub early before our monthly meeting to duck into the slot car racing store and track across the street.

In honor of MGB's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, 1962-2012, Scalextric the manufacturer of slot cars, tracks, and accessories is planning on producing a special MGB to help celebrate this unique event. To find out more, go to there website: <a href="https://www.scalextric.com">www.scalextric.com</a> and click on the menu that says, "Shop," then click "Cars," and a screen of cars will appear. You want to click on "Classics," to find the MGB on page two. It's a limited edition of 3,500 models and it's not released yet. It will be a copy of "Old Faithful." Here's how the car is described on their website, "tribute to the

class win at the 1966 Targa Florio road race for the works MGB roadster, registration GRX 307D, known as 'Old Faithful' – because it never failed. Driven by Timo Makinen and John Rhodes, the MGB finished 1st in the 1600cc class and 9th overall, with only the likes of Ferrari and Porsche ahead." They are also planning on releasing a copy of a Jim Adams, Merle Brennan and Frank Morell 1964 Sebring model. We saw the original at Laguna Seca a few years ago. Keep in mind, Scalextric said they reserve the right to change or modify what B it is until production. So, it may change.

Naturally, there's nothing cooler than the B. Of course, it's also a great way to build a collection of your dream vintage cars. For me, they include 1966 Morris Mini, 1970 Ford GT 40 Mark II Sebring Special (ok, it's not British. But, there's always an exception to the rule), 1957 Jaguar D-type, 1968 Lotus Cosworth.

Take a few minutes and check out the website. Buy a track and a few cars, if not for you, for your kids or your grand kids, and fellow MG friends.





### MGOC Bylaws



The Bylaws Update Committee (Past President Bob Stine, Vice-President Tim Polidoroff, and Treasurer Mike Jacobsen) was organized last month to work on the Constitution and Bylaws, which were originally written in the late 1950s. They've been "patched" from time to time (the last update was in 2006) but they've never been overhauled until now. The committee isn't finished but we thought a status report was in order.

### Changes being proposed include:

- Collapsing the four membership categories to two.
- Replacing the tiered fee schedule for new members with a flat rate.
- Specifying the exact composition of the Board.
- Clarifying the rules for authorizing Club expenditures.
- Allowing for electronic meetings in certain circumstances.
- Make club membership open to anyone with an interest in MG automobiles (MG ownership is no longer required).

We plan to have the complete list of revisions available for review in January, followed by an election to vote on the changes. Meanwhile, if you have any questions or comments, contact one of the committee members - contact info is on the inside front cover of *The Octagon*. Watch this space for further information!




