
Tech Session Bullet Points

Nice Rack!



For my birthday this year, my wife Vicky gave me a luggage rack for my green MGB. All I needed to do was install it. So looking for the directions, I found none. I guess the supplier figures that if you order it, you must know how to install it.

I asked Craig Kuenzinger if we could use the Lab portion of the Tech session last month to install it, to which he replied "Yes." I'm thinking great, "a bunch of MG guys that have done this in the past, what could go wrong."







Well, of course nothing – the rack went on like a dream and I couldn't be happier. (They even let me drill the holes!!) Special thanks to Craig, Andy, Mike and everyone else who helped participate.

Here are few bullet points to consider when installing a rack:

- build the rack first with loosened bolts prior to fitting
- blue tape the rack bottoms and trunk deck so as not to scratch your finish.
- measure about 75 times before even thinking about drilling the four holes
- measure another 25 times before drilling the holes
- drill a small pilot hole at first (use a slow drill and let the bit do all the work)
- finish the holes for the bolts with a uni-bit metal cutter
- paint the inside of the holes with some touch up paint just like they do on the golf course
- use nonmetal washers on the underside of the deck lid so as not to leave scratches.
- cut the rubber pad to size before you place the rack on the deck lid
- hand tighten the bolts to a nice snug fit

<u>Regalia</u>: David Wright brought two extra large club jackets. Steve Kellogg and John Bertolotti each purchased a jacket (Mike Jacobsen will research the price). David has one more jacket at home and Craig Kuenzinger requested to purchase it. There was discussion regarding purchasing items with the club logo and some members knew of possible sources for logo merchandise.

The Octagon: Editor Felix Lee was unable to attend.

<u>Website</u>: This is a work in progress according to Webmaster Steve Kellogg. He suggested that two sections be formed – one for members only and one for the public. Everyone agreed and also agreed that the MGOC Bylaws should be included in the members-only section.
