From the Editor...

... how (MG) ... played a critical role in the evolution of the British Monarchy...

HM Queen Elizabeth II was born on April 21, 1926, at 2:40 am, at 17 Bruton Street in Mayfair, London. She was the first child of the Duke and Duchess of York and, at the time, stood third in the line of succession to the throne after Edward, Prince of Wales (later King Edward VIII), and her father, George (later King George VI). It was never suspected, at the time, that her father would ever become King, or that Elizabeth would become Queen, after him.

Princess Elizabeth was christened Elizabeth Alexandra Mary, after her mother, while her two middle names are those of her paternal great-grandmother, Queen Alexandra, and paternal grandmother, Queen Mary. Both Princess Elizabeth and her sister, Princess Margaret, were educated at home. Princess Elizabeth was a strong swimmer and won the Children's Challenge Shield at London's Bath Club when she was only 13 years old. In the same year, Princess Elizabeth first met, then, Prince Philip of Greece and Denmark. A letter written by Queen Elizabeth, just months before her wedding, reveals how she and Prince Philip first met and fell in love.

In this touching letter, penned in 1947, to a personal friend, Betty Shew, Queen Elizabeth describes how she met Prince Philip in 1939, discusses his love for fast cars, how the couple spent many nights dancing at nightclubs together, and were once chased by a photographer, as they cruised the streets of London, in his "tiny" MG.

Apparently, Queen Elizabeth, goes on about "how proud" Prince Philip was of both his MG and being an MG owner. If so, MG would clearly have a claim, on how its namesake played a critical role in the evolution of the British Monarchy. In some ways, I guess we'll never know. Clearly, history may have been very different if an MG were not involved. Just another example of MG Love ...

Got an ocean view at the Best Western Cavalier so life is as Larry David would say "pretty pretty pretty good."







True confession: I was looking for a Triumph. I had to get a car for the commute to junior college, and I when I told my Dad I was thinking of a TR-2, 3, or 4, he was OK with that. The car I ended up with was one he found in the back lot of our local British car dealer: an MGA. I had no idea what an MGA was, but it seemed to fill the bill, and after \$700 changed hands, it was mine. This was in 1974. When my girlfriend first saw the car, she said "lit's so tiny it looks like a baby." Baby G has been its



When I discovered the British Motor Industry Heritage Trust, I wrote for the car's "birth certificate." The certificate told me the options and colors the car was when new, plus the build dates. Have you ever heard the common wisdom that you don't want a car made on a Friday afternoon or a Monday morning due to absenteeism on the production line? My car was begun on Thursday, December 31, and was shipped on Monday, January 4. Not only did I have a weekend car, it was a New Year's Eve car too, possibly the worst combination. My Dad claimed that explained why it had so many problems.

Many girlfriends learned to drive a stick shift in the MGA. One was too short to reach the pedals even with the seat at the end of its travel, so I relocated the seat slides farther forward. The next girlfriend was even shorter, so I moved the seat again, and got used to driving with my knees very bent. In 1999 I replaced the original floorboards, and the seat moved back to its stock location. Wow - so much room now!

Why have I kept the car for 42 years and counting? Partly because I'm constantly meeting people that used to have one and are sorry they ever sold it, and I don't ever want to be like that. But I think it's mostly because I've made so many friends through having an MG. Any car can get you where you want to go, but an MG also gets you what can't be bought.

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




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MGOC Business Meeting Minutes
