

NAMGAR GT-42: Mike Jacobsen - Absent - Andy said that the contract has been signed (by NAMGAR) with the hotel in Solvang so the event is a go.

NEW BUSINESS - Propose increasing annual dues and new membership to \$25.00 and an amount to cover Octagon expenses.

A motion was made to increase MGOC Annual Membership dues to cover increasing costs, particularly with the printing and mailing of the Octagon each month to members who request it to be mailed. A discussion was had regarding the costs to mail the Octagon. Based on the @\$2,000 spent on mailing the Octagon last year and @ 65 recipients, the cost is about \$30 per year per member who receives the Octagon in the mail.

The motion is:

- Increase annual family membership dues from \$20.00 to \$25.00.
- If a member wishes to receive a printed *Octagon* via the USPS, their dues will be \$35.00.
- Corresponding family memberships will be increased from \$10.00 to \$15.00.
- If a corresponding member wishes to receive ta printed *Octagon*, their dues will be \$25.00.
- Prorated Dues throughout the year will be:
 - If joining in July through September, dues and initiation are \$25 and \$35 with printed
 - October through December, \$20 and \$30 with printed Octagon.
 - January through March, \$15 and \$25 with printed Octagon.
 - If one joins from April through June, send in \$25 or \$35 with printed Octagon for initiation and dues and the membership will be automatically extended to July of the following year.
