Enjoying an early Father's Day, MGOC Style

Greetings from the Happiest Place in the World

No, not Disneyland ... Copenhagen!

In March, an independent report, underwritten by United Nations, Denmark was named the happiest country in the world. The study took into account a variety of quality of life factors and concluded, Denmark is it! It is a wonderful country with friendly people and nearly everyone speaks fluent English, which makes it an easy place to visit.

This past February, I was fortunate to have work bring me to Copenhagen, Denmark for a few days to see this wonderful city in Scandinavia. The name Copenhagen in Danish means "Merchants Harbor." The city is also known as "the Paris of the North." architecture is a balanced mixed of medieval and modern. There are 406 islands around mainland Denmark. If you push them all together, the total size would be 43,000 km², which is around the same size of Switzerland. However, this country doesn't have mountains or hills. The city is very compact and walkable. It is more of a bicycle than a car city; 37% of residents commute on a bike everyday. In the winter, 80% keep biking regardless of the snow or rain. Only 29% of the residents own cars. Part of this is due to the expense, there's a 180% of value purchase tax to buy a car.

Although, cars are costly, this country still has a very active motor community. For example, Denmark hosts an annual Historic Grand Prix. Cars compete separately in various classes, including a large number of vehicles in the pre-World War I class. About 200 vintage cars participate, covering such legendary names as Bentleys from the '20s, Bugattis from the 30's to post war era Jaguars and Porsches from the 50's, and then they move into the 60s with Lotus Cortinas, Alfa Romeos and Jaguar E's and MGs of course!

A few months prior to leaving, I reached out to Lars Thousig, who is President of the MG Car Club of Denmark. He was very kind to extend an invitation to join him and his wife for dinner on my last night in town. This part was the highlight of my trip. Lars picked me up at the Marriott hotel and gave me a mini tour on the way to his house. We took a

through spin Amalienborg Palace, which was built 1750-60. Denmark has the world's oldest monarchy that dates back to 1397. When the flag bearing the Queen's colors and coat of arms is flying, she is in town. Next, we saw the little mermaid statue and from there it was off to the Royal Docks of Copenhagen. ship was not in, however, right next to the docks was St. Alban's church built in 1891, which is a part of the Church of England. Up the road, we passed by Nyboder Naval Barracks that where built in 1631 in it's first stage and followed by it's second stage in 1795. It still houses military personal, however, civilians can apply to live there now as well. We left the city going through Osterbro district ,which was developed in the

1850s, and is consider a tony section by the three lakes.

They have a beautiful ranch style house in Herlev which is a suburb. Inside was classic Scandinavian style décor. It was a treat to experience Danish hospitality and what they call, "hygge," which is about creating a welcoming, warm, and friendly place. His wife Grethe created a delicious classic Dane dinner of pork steak, a special red cabbage salad and potatoes. I had a wonderful time learning more about the history of their country and the local MG experience.




Lars owns an excellent example of a 1960 MGA roadster. Very well maintained, looks like it just rolled off the show room floor. They have a very active club with 600 members that participate in a wide range of different activities. This year is their sixtieth anniversary. It was a pleasant surprise to hear more women are joining the club today, and in order to get them more involved, they are hosting tech sessions for the new members, to get them up to speed. It was a nice surprise to hear that the government reached out to the vintage car community and asked them how they would like to be regulated and in a group effort, everyone agreed that vintage cars should be inspected every eight years for safety, much less obtrusive than UK's Ministry of Transport (MOT) which is annual. For 2014, the Danish Centre was elected to host the European Event of the





1967 MG MGB Mark 1 Roadster (VIN: G-HN3-U / 138261-G) Built on September 22, 1967, this car features factory Laycock de Normanville overdrive, heater, packaway hood, wire wheels, and dealer optional BMC radio. From 2001 to 2002 this MGB underwent a rotisserie restoration at the hands of noted MG restoration specialist Mike Goodman of Mike Goodman's Sports Car Service Ltd in Van Nuys, CA. The car was stripped to its component parts, and every parts of the car was restored or replaced. Every mechanical component including the engine, transmission, Laycock de Normanville overdrive unit, hydraulics, suspension, fuel system, cooling system, differential, and axles were inspected, tested, rebuilt or



replaced with NOS or UK sourced parts. Each nut and bolt was removed and correctly plated. The car was painted Tartan Red and fitted with a black fold down top. All new glass was installed. The interior was done in hand sewn black Connolly leather with correct red piping. The leather was hand picked and sourced from the UK, as was the correct Wilton wool carpeting. All the gauges and knobs were restored to new condition, and the original BMC radio was restored to perfect working order. To finish off the interior a very rare and beautiful period Les Leston wood steering wheel was fitted. The electrical system was completely rebuilt and restored including the generator, voltage regulator, starter, windshield wiper motor, and overdrive electrical switches. A new wiring harness from British Wiring was installed, and each circuit checked and bullet connectors soldered just as original. Every attempt was made to keep the car period correct down to the use of original Lucas headlamps and original Champion NY9 sparkplugs. When the car was complete it was kept primarily as a show car, and over the next decade it would go on to win multiple show. It graced the cover and interior of Classic Motorsports magazine in 2004 for the "MGB: The best sports car ever?" story. The car comes with complete documentation of it restoration both with receipts and photographs.
