I was unable to watch the valve cover races because I was in a planning meeting for MG2007 during the event. Mike Jacobsen sent me an email announcing Robert's success. He also said Ken Gittings won second place and Randy Grossman won third place; I don't quite understand that because, according to the rules, there is only one winner in valve cover races...the winning racer in each heat advances to the next race until there is only one car left.

My son came to visit from Delaware the week prior to MGs by the Bay and was on hand to assist during the show. We had a very nice visit and he appreciated the opportunity to see how many different models of MG there are.

**Tour Leader Training Session/Trial Run** – A tour training session/trial run (for MG2007) will take place June 17. Mike Jacobsen will lead it and people who want to volunteer to lead or assist tours at MG2007 will receive guidance on how to do so effectively. Each tour will require a minimum of a leader and someone at the end to keep track of participants.

Part of the training will be the effective use of the communication radios we plan to use for the tours. The leader and "tail gunner" will communicate by radio to facilitate lane changes, turns, and announcements when participants have problems or get caught at red lights, etc. When tours include larger groups, a third or fourth person may be added to relay messages by radio. I have seen this process conducted very productively during tours conducted by the PT Cruisers of Silicon Valley, where we had as many as 100 cars on a drive!

**Dyno-Day II** – Because some members were disappointed at the Dyno Day in April by equipment failure, the event has been scheduled for a second time on June 16. Take your car to see how much power it actually places at the rear wheels; find out how to fine-tune the engine. Don't sit home and wish you were doing something fun...come on out and join us!

# MGs by the Bay

It was a cold and blustery morning to welcome us to this year's MGs by the Bay at the Sane Leandro Marina. The skies were mostly cloudy and the wind was biting us all, but especially those of us crazy enough to wear shorts in the second week of May!

We had a smaller turn out for MGs by the Bay than previous years. The MGOC board chalked up the lower attendance to members and local MG owner's planning to attend MG 2007 and skip MGs by the Bay. We had about 70 cars fill the main parking lot in front of El Torito.

All post-war classes of MGs were well represented. There were a good number of T-Series cars present. The MGAs had both coupes and roadsters on the field and MGBs filled out the parking area. Of course we had a few Magnette saloons and Midgets present too.

This year for the first time Valve Cover Races were a major event at MGs by the Bay. We had half a dozen cars out for the races with Ken Gittings fielding two racers. Robert Milner's racer "Shock and Awe" awed the crowd with the engineering that went into the racer. Inside the MG valve cover is a weight to help pull the racer down the track ahead of the competition. Once reaching the flat part of the track, Shock and Awe drops the weight and speeds ahead of the competing racer.

The more competitive racers had skateboard wheels with roller bearings to reduce friction. Several racers found that positioning the car squarely on the track is critical. If the racer hits the outside edge or crosses the centerline of the track the racer is disqualified.

As the day went on the weather improved considerably so we could remove the sweatshirts and even a shorts were mostly comfortable in the cool afternoon breeze.

# Sacramento Show Demonstrates the Power of Car Collectors

As a finale to the Association of California Car Clubs (ACCC) annual legislative conference in Sacramento, California in May, a car show was held on the steps of the State Capitol as a show of presence to the policy makers and legislators in the capitol. A variety of cars were on display, including three British cars: an MG TD, my Jaguar 3.8S sedan, and a concours-quality Triumph TR6 owned by Anna Belle Pugh.

The purpose of this show was to acquaint the legislators and staff of the importance and enjoyment of the car collector and restoration hobby in the state and in so doing to attempt to influence them in the bills pending that are either favorable or unfavorable to the continuation of the car hobby in the state.

- \* There is a bill pending that would extend the number of years that year-of-manufacture black and yellow license plates can be used; Assembly Bill 462. The ACCC supports this bill.
- \* A proposed change to the smog check regulations that would require an *annual* smog check for any car over 15 years old and newer than 1976 model year; Assembly Bill 616. The ACCC strongly disagrees with this bill.
- \* A bill expanding the criteria a local agency can deem a vehicle "abandoned" (Even if stored on private property!) and issue a 10-day requirement for removal. This could directly impact those who house or store a vehicle on their property for a future restoration or project or for spare parts. The ACCC strongly disagrees with this bill.

California hobbyists and clubs are strongly urged to join ACCC to protect your rights and the rights of your fellow car enthusiasts. You may not see an immediate threat now but unity is strength for future threats that *will* impact you. If any of these bills are of concern to you, now is the time to contact your local assembly person and senator and express your opinion.

# MGs Set to Roll Off U.K. Assembly Line

The first MG TF built at the Longbridge, England factory since 2005 is expected to roll off the assembly line in late May, ending the plant's two year hiatus, as Nanjing Automobile brings the MG marque back to life. The company unveiled its first cars built in Nanjing, China, a sports car and saloon, in March.

The Longbridge factory is fitted out to build MG TFs and will start production on May 29<sup>th</sup>. The company will begin selling cars in the second half of the year. Nanjing Auto is working to establish a dealer network and has interested parties in Britain, Germany, Australia, and several other Commonwealth countries. Zhang Xin, the general manager of the Nanjing Auto unit, said the company hopes that at least 50% of it sales are outside of China.

Nanjing Auto acquired most of the assets of MG Rover in 2005. The remaining assets went to Shanghai Auto, a competitor to Nanjing also in China. China is quickly becoming an automobile exporter. Its 2006 exports were 300,000, nearly double the previous year. Despite the increase, Chinese automakers are finding it difficult to break into the major western car markets.
